<u>Colossians 3:9-10</u> "<u>since</u> you <u>laid</u> aside the old self with its evil practices, and have <u>put</u> on the new self who is being renewed."

Colossians 3

vs1 "If then you have been raised with Christ"

vs2 "set your mind on the things above"

<u>vs5</u> "consider the members of earthly body as dead" <u>Let's look at two</u> <u>concepts of the garden together:</u>

Walking in Repentance

Romans 2:4 says "that the kindness of God leads to repentance."

<u>2 Corinthians 7:10</u> "for the sorrow that is according to the will of God produces repentance without regret, leading to salvation, but the sorrow of the world produces death."

<u>Romans 8:1-2</u> says "there is no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus. For the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus has set you free from the law of sin and death."

Matthew 3:8 "bring forth fruit in keeping with repentance."

The overarching premise for our teaching today is encompassed in this reality, Jesus called us into repentance, and we continual confess our sins free from condemnation as we are molded into Christlikeness to produce good fruit.

<u>Colossians 3:9-10</u> "<u>since</u> you <u>laid</u> aside the old self with its evil practices, and have <u>put</u> on the new self who is being renewed."

Paul uses the word "<u>since</u>" here.

<u>Hebrews 12:1-3</u> "therefore since we have a great cloud of witnesses surrounding us, let us lay aside every encumbrance, and the sin in which entangles us, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, fixing our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. For consider Him who has endured such hostility by sinners against Himself, so that you not grow weary and loose heart."

Walking in Repentance

<u>Psalm 139:23</u> "search me, O God, and know my heart; Try me and know my anxious thoughts; and see if there be any hurtful way in me, and lead me in the everlasting way.

Luke 6:45 "the good man out of the good treasure of his heart brings forth what is good; and the evil man out of the evil treasure brings forth what is evil; for his mouth speaks that which fills his heart.

Ephesians 4:17-24.

<u>Philippians 2:12</u> as we are "work out our salvation with fear and trembling."

Walking with the Vine
